Dear Families,

What a busy start to term 2 we have had. Our school participates in many activities throughout the year and the last fortnight has been full of learning and outdoor fun. Warrnambool Seahawks players took part in the 3-6 sports block teaching our students many new skills on the basketball court. Students also journeyed to the town library to participate in author talks with Gabrielle Wang (Year 3/4s) and Cristy Burne (Year 5/6s). We also held our annual year3/4 camp and joined in Neighbourhood House Week celebrations.

Camp Kangaroobie

Year 3/4 campers returned yesterday from 'Camp Kangaroobie", near the famous Great Ocean Road and 12 Apostles. After a short bus ride, the students arrived at camp full of excitement. Shouts of 'freedom' were made by several kids as they ran around the courtyard overwhelmed with joy. Local camp dogs, Echo and Luna were besieged with pats from adoring campers.

Throughout the three-day camp, students enjoyed the outdoors, hiking long, narrow tracks to the Princetown Beach, where they tobogganed down sand dunes. Students 'tried their hand' at bush cooking, making yummy damper, played a bush survival game 'Live and Death' and completed a challenging obstacle course. Driving around the farm in the back of a locked trailer, as part of the farm tour certainly triggered lots of laughs, where cows and pigs were fed, and a couple of students may have kissed a pig's butt!

There was plenty of free time allowing the students to engage with each other and form new and stronger friendships. Students also learnt about performing dinner and cleaning duties and keeping rooms clean, skills that we are sure parents will now be able to see (or now enforce) at home.



The Department of Education has released a new statewide timeline for enrolling in Foundation (Prep) for the 2024 school year.

If you have a child starting primary school in 2024, it's time to enrol. Make sure to submit your enrolment application by **Friday 28 July 2023.**

If you are enrolling the sibling of a student at our school for Foundation in 2024, and both children will be attending our school at the same time, your child is prioritised for a place at our school as per the department's Placement Policy.

It is important to follow the state-wide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation. Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.

Warrnambool West Primary School has partnered with **TheirCare** to provide quality care, flexibility and commitment to deliver on our promise to your school community.


