Late students miss the opportunity to catch up with peers and staff prior to school and the chance to get organised and prepared for a solid day of learning. Late students miss out on vital instruction at the beginning of the day which may place them at risk of not understanding the learning intentions for that lesson. Furthermore, they may become disruptive to the learning of others and the class in general. Rare instances of lateness are understandable and unavoidable. We ask all parents and guardians to support this improvement by ensuring that their children are at school by no later than 8.55am, ready for a prompt 9am start in the classroom.

Camp is so much more than time away from home

The rain fell as we disembarked from the bus last night and said farewell to our year 5 and 6 students from a wonderful three days on Melbourne camp. Gratitude from parents, a thank you for 'putting up with us' from one particular student and seeing the weary but smiling faces from students as they wheeled their suitcases away is one aspect that I feel I have the privilege of experiencing.

Camp is so much more than just time away from home. It is the ultimate time staff and students can spend time away from the physical four walls of the classroom and experience learning in a whole new manner and an opportunity to teach each other the skills of life.

As we walked along Flinders Street on Tuesday, I engaged in a conversation with a year 6 girl in regards to her interpretation of camp. In her eyes, school camp is not 'school' or even a form of learning, it is simply time away from classroom and the routines of a school day. As we discussed this further, I listed reasons why camp is definitely an extension of school, although a little different than the school corridors and classroom. The experiences and opportunities I shared only touch the surface of the benefits of attending camp. Students learn and experience:

- Social skills and the expectations of culture in various settings
- An opportunity to disconnect with technology and reconnect with self and others
- Build lasting relationships with other students
- Staff and students strengthen connections and students see the 'human' side of their teacher
- Learn new activities and skills, new sports, taking public transport and budgeting their money.
- Improve independence and personal organisation
- Expand their experiences of nature, city life and culture

A structured school camp not only looks at the learnings based on curriculum, context and experiences, it takes students to a new environment of experiential learning, where they are encouraged to push beyond what they believe they can achieve and learn from the reality of our world and what there is to offer. These things cannot be found in a text book or a website, it is the real experience of learning that students will take away with them forever.

These are all normal emotions, but there are hurtful and helpful ways to express them. 
