

Next Monday, a team of twenty-one students will represent our school at the District Schools Athletics Carnival to be held at Brauerander Park. Members of the team performed exceptionally well at our house sports. This event gives students the opportunity to meet students from neighbouring schools as well as compete at a higher level.

Congratulations to year one/two teacher Miss Madison Hoy who officially graduated last Thursday from Deakin University – Warrnambool Campus. Madi joined other graduate teachers to celebrate the significant milestone of the completion of a Bachelor of Education. Madi always aspired to one day become a teacher. After leaving school, she juggled both work commitments as an ES staff member and university studies which was at times

challenging. We are very fortunate to have Madi as part of the West staff and wish her all the best in her teaching career.

Although the end of term is only a few days away we still have several events organised for our students. Today our school community acknowledged the diversity within our school by wearing a splash of orange as part of Harmony Day and crazy-mismatched socks for World Down Syndrome Day. The powerful message of both Harmony Day and World Down Syndrome Day is 'Everybody Belongs' and we are all unique in our own way. Acknowledging these days gives us an opportunity to truly 'live' our value of inclusiveness and celebrate the diversity within our school whilst working to remove barriers that still exist in the wider community. As a school, we play a critical role in strengthening cultural inclusion in our community. By providing safe, inclusive and welcoming classrooms, we hope to help students feel a sense of belonging and connection to our school and the wider community.

This Friday is **National Ride2 School Day.** Students are encouraged to ride, scoot, skate or walk to school to celebrate this day. National Ride2School Day is Australia's biggest celebration of active travel and is a great way to encourage children to be more active when travelling to school. Being active on the journey to school helps to create healthy habits for our students, and it's good for the environment too! Riding, walking, scooting or skating to school means there are fewer cars on the road, which results in a reduction in noise pollution, energy use and carbon emissions.

If you live too far away from school to actively travel the whole way, part way is okay. Stop the car a few blocks before the school and walk, ride, scooter or skate the rest of the way. Every little bit helps you and the environment. Mr Hackett has

To live harmoniously in society, at home and at school, it is essential that we ensure that everyone from different backgrounds is made to feel equal and involved and is treated with fairness and respect. Here at our school, all staff foster an environment where students from various cultural backgrounds come together to learn and grow, and this is a concept close to our hearts. Within our school setting, these celebratory days offer a unique opportunity to showcase and celebrate the richness of diversity present among our students and staff.

Ending the stereotypes is the 2024 theme for World Down Syndrome Day. A stereotype is a set idea that people have. They can be positive or negative and often inaccurate.

This year's theme acknowledges the need for changing opinions and misconceptions and create an informed understanding of people with Down Syndrome. People are all different. Each person with Down syndrome is different. Each person with an intellectual disability is different. For every single person, we don't all act the same way or like the same things, we each have our individual identity, interests, likes and dislikes, gifts and talents...and that is the special thing about human beings and the world we live in!

#### Free Internet deal extension

The Australian Government has announced that they are extending the School Student Broadband Initiative until 31 December 2025. The extension means that the SSBI nomination period will remain open until 31 December 2024 with free National Broadband Network (nbn) internet service for all new and existing families on the SSBI until 31 December 2025. For existing SSBI families who have already signed up, this means their SSBI service will automatically be extended until 31 December 2025 (no further eligibility checks will be required). For eligible families who connect before the end of this year, they will get up to two years of free **nbn** broadband.

#### Student Internet Program - Anglicare Victoria

To be eligible, families must:

Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including Prep in Qld/Vic/Tas, Kindy in NSW, Reception in SA, Transition in NT/ACT and Pre-Primary in WA).

2 Not have an active National Broadband Network (nbn®) Internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.

☑ Live in a premises that can access the National Broadband Network via a standard connection – this will be checked for you.

2 Not have had an active **nbn** connection during the previous 14 days.

For further information families are encouraged to call 1800 954 610 (10am – 6pm AEDT Monday to Friday, excluding Victorian Public Holidays) and our team will check your eligibility.
